4. Campaigning begins immediately after the candidates meeting, any campaigning activity that falls within the scope of pre-campaigning is prohibited prior to this time.

During the course of these elections you are responsible for not only your own behaviour, but also for the behaviour of your supporter(s)

Any breaches of regulations by individuals will be fully investigated.

WHAT IS A MANIFESTO?

When running for election, candidates need to tell voters what they believe in and what they plan to do if they win.

This is done through a document called a manifesto.

In simple terms, a manifesto outlines the candidate's goals and plans if they are successful.

To create an effective manifesto, candidates should talk to people, especially students, to understand their concerns and find solutions.

The manifesto should clearly state what the candidate aims to achieve during their term and ensure these goals are practical and attainable.

All manifesto will be posted for all part-time and full time officers alongside their 200 word summary and picture.

MAPPING OUT YOUR MANIFESTO

When writing your manifesto, be realistic about your promises; avoid making unrealistic claims that you can't fulfill, as voters will notice.

Understand what motivates your potential voters by talking to students, listen to their concerns and ideas. Make sure your proposals align with what students actually want; otherwise, you might appear out of touch.

Discuss your ideas with various people such as friends, peers, society members, and Course Reps. Get their feedback and focus on a few key issues instead of overwhelming your manifesto with numerous points.
