# ACCESSIBILITY OFFICER BHAVAN BAINS

- All disabilities matter, even if you can't see them: Disabled does not have to mean physically impaired, anyone can be and they do not have to disclose what they have in order to justify themselves, or "prove" that they are dealing with something. Education is not always out there, but this can be changed through a variety of methods such as engaging workshops, resources and targeted outreach.
- Tackling the lack of support with health concerns/ anxiety.
- Mental health at the forefront: Let's break the stigma and put mental health first! Promoting diversity & inclusivity.
- Support for undiagnosed needs: Unsure whether or not you may be considered to have a disability? Have you felt misled about your personal needs in the past being unable to access the relevant services? I strive to ensure students are acknowledged whether or not they have been officially diagnosed, prioritising equality for everyone who has a shared that same doubt at some point – no matter where along they are on their journey.



- Advocating for safe spaces: Sometimes it's just too loud, too bright, too many people and/or too much and that's okay.
- Being a familiar face & a person you can trust.

## **CASPIAN O'DONNELL**

Accessibility advocation is something that is immensely close to my heart. As someone with Autism, I have had to spend the majority of my life advocating for myself and others.

I strive to be a voice for disabled students across the university. Being able to build upon my personal experiences as a disabled individual and apply it to the university community as a whole is immensely important to me, as I want to be able to help students know that the university is here for us, not against us.



Having access to safe spaces on campus, alongside easy-to-navigate resources is important in maintaining the wellbeing of disabled students as much as it is for any other student. However, it may look a little different. Working towards having spaces on campus to decompress would help cultivate student success while providing a safe environment to regulate in the ways that work for them.

Society is quick to overlook disabilities and dismiss others for being different. In the world of inclusivity, disabled individuals can be forgotten, especially when the disabilities are "invisible." Cultivating a nature of understanding and acceptance propels forward the university's goals to create well-rounded students open to different perspectives.

## **MARIA ISON**

Hello, my name is Maria pronouns she/her, I am running to be to be the next accessibility officer. I am a psychology undergrad and my goals are to of course make university accessible for everyone through identifying areas in need of improvement within university.

I would make it easy for discussions around accessibility to take place including any issues or problems students may face at university, how I would implement this is by setting up anonymous forum. So that voices are heard, and change can be made, this is something I truly feel passionate about.

University needs to be a safe space were people can grow as individuals and shouldn't have to deal with inaccessible spaces putting other students at a disadvantage.

For me as a dyslex individual who struggles with their mental health I understand the challenges people with learning disability, mental health conditions, long term health conditions face in their day to day life adding university to the mix makes things even more complicated.



### **SIAN WORTON**

Developing on my work from this year I hope to prioritise the following:

- Maintaining communications with my current contacts in different university departments in order to enable conversations to occur about improving university processes and facilities.
- Continuing the research and collection of resources in an accessible format for students with accessibility needs on a variety of topics (e.g. applying for benefits; academic accommodations; transition into university life).



- Further pressuring the university into fulfilling their duties of providing reliable disabled facilities across both campus and accommodation. This includes improving maintenance response times and communication with students about any works that could have an impact on accessibility and student's day-to-day life.
- Proceeding to represent students with accessibility needs in whichever ways they may need (e.g. conversing with course/content leaders to improve accessibility; providing support when faced with discrimination).
- Leading campaigns on behalf of student raised issues to improve both accessibility and student satisfaction.
- Improve accessibility in university managed accommodation sites on the most important issues affecting students (e.g. moving in day procedures; returning to accommodation; lift maintenance; blue badge parking).
