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invest in the Community Kitchen

I am currently already working with contacts in the Social Impact Team to secure funding for a Community Kitchen overhaul during this academic year. If elected, this is a project that I would have the facilities to greatly upscale, including:

- streamlining food donations directly from all LSP outlets on campus
- move the food logging system online (rather than paper forms) for greater efficiency
- increased promotion, online signposting and physical signage on campus

revamp the room booking system

- if elected, I plan to work with the Activities Team to overhaul the current room booking process
- this will involve seeking to introduce automatic allocation (similar to the Library system) to shorten waiting times and reduce uncertainty

increase participation in student voice

- push for more students

Why would I be a good fit?

- With the creation of my own society, I have a complete experience of the ins and outs of running, developing and organising events for a society at Leicester University.
- I have already worked with the Student's Union and current SU officers to help to organise events and activities.
- As part of my voluntary role in the Societies Council, a group designed to focus on new student group applications, grant funding requests and projects with the current Activities officer, I have the crucial background knowledge necessary to truly understand how societies and activities work within the university.
- As a social secretary, I have had many opportunities to communicate and work with organisations outside of the university.
- As a covid officer for Rugby League, I guided our return to play as we returned to normal life. Carefully reviewing current coronavirus trends and local restrictions is my bread and butter.
- I have direct, clear and achievable goals as Activities Officer, which you can see below.

WHAT NEEDS FOCUS

New student groups get little to no support following their creation and affiliation.

A significant lack of interaction between the wider student population and the Student's Union.

Societies at Leicester appear more as a group of individual and isolated clubs rather than parts of a much wider network of students.

Events and Activities that are run on campus are not widely known about.

A lack of clear volunteering groups or opportunities at the university.

Very little focus on Sustainability within the university.

HOW I PLAN TO MAKE CHANGE

Emphasise and restructure the way we create societies at Leicester.

More in-person interaction and support following affiliation.

Fully utilising the societies council to act as a point of contact and help for new student groups.

Continuing Manoj's plans to improve student group support.

Bolstering the Student Union officer presence and involvement in activities around the university.

Interacting more directly with student groups and their activities at the university.

Work closely with different student groups to encourage and help to organise and promote more public, accessible and collaborative events. [E.g. Charity sports matches]

Help to transition from faceless emails to more personable and face-to-face interactions and support from the Student's Union.

Improve and explore new promotion techniques to best reach students within the university beyond social media. [Posters, leaflets, promotional staff on campus, etc.]

Exploring local volunteering opportunities and presenting these to student groups to encourage their members to consider helping in related voluntary work.

Work closely with sustainability student groups and organisations to see how best to educate others and promote a cleaner and better university in all levels.

Some more specific goals

Reviewing the whole process for society creation would involve providing further details for those interested, such as "What succeeds what doesn't" etc. Continuing the fundamental idea that any group, no matter the size, can create a space for themselves. More clear promoting and welcoming of newly affiliated societies as well as helping them with their next steps.

Providing additional details and information about student group grant funding, such as more detailed idea on what sort of things do people request money for, what succeeds and what doesn't and in general exposing this system more widely so that groups know when they can or should use it.

Being more transparent with the workings of this system with clear dates for meetings and creating consistent and regular meetings for societies council.

Strong collaboration with sports officer and sports council, promoting many more events open to all as well as encouraging further transparency on their end too. This would involve advertising the group and its work to promote the voice of sports at the university.

Aiming to make facilities and venues that are available around the university as well as the city of Leicester (such as Victoria Park) more accessible and clearer to student groups that need them but may not know where to go or how to access these facilities.

Reviewing the best methods for promotions of events around campus beyond social media. As stated previously, with more in-person and physical promotion which is now more available in a 'post-COVID' campus.

Closely monitoring the current climate with regards to COVID-19 and its impact on the events and activities of our clubs. (International trips, potential new waves and new restrictions)

Generally trying to have an open and clear presence within the university and community. Meeting and interacting with as many societies and students as possible. We are part of a community, not a clump of separate groups with different interests.

Helping to organise TOUR within the university. It was a bit of an anomaly this year but next year I will take charge and reduce the stress and confusion of different tour dates and lack of communication within the university.

Helping to promote potential social ideas for societies. Creating a clear list of venues for weekly socials as well as places for alternative style socials such as Ninja-warrior, Laser Tag, Club meals etc.

Contacting establishments around the city to see where is best for student groups to organise events and socials as well as finding sponsorships.
