Sustainability:

- Produce a sustainability plan for the Student Union.
- Embed sustainability into the curriculum by <u>funding</u> <u>carbon literacy training</u> for all students who want to become more sustainable.
- Do more to <u>support and promote</u> our voluntary groups like Green Bubble and Food Rescue.
- Make the Green Careers Fair a <u>yearly</u> event.





MY PRIORITIES #REEDVITALISE


COMMUNITY:


Since many students' mental health is suffering as a result of their inability to make their fee payments on time, I will collaborate with the institution to launch a new pricing structure with small installments.



HOW I INTEND ON IMPROVING STUDENT EXPERIENCE ON CAMPUS

- Bridge the gap in conversations about domestic and international politics and its personal impact on students. This may involve increasing wellbeing support and creating workshops or support groups in order to express feelings and anxieties.
- Help further to decolonise the university by implementing first year modules that interact with relevant degree content from a anti-colonial perspective where applicable and not currently implemented.
- Ensure restocks of sanitary items are consistent and available in all areas.
- Continue with events for significant cultural/religious holidays on campus, as well as introduce more that have yet to be represented.
- Celebrate other liberation events, that include dates of decolonisation of commonwealth states, and express awareness of the history.
- Continue to promote and engage with societies that represent minority groups.
- Improve experiences with AccessAbility and Wellbeing services.
- Continue to create a safe space for students to discuss experiences with discrimination and hate crimes, and guide students toward support and how to report. This is especially necessary for when students feel dismissed or implied to be overreacting.
- Reach out to academics to hold seminars pertaining to liberation.

- LOWER FOOD PRICES on campus, with a promise to only increase prices inline with increases in student finance
- FINANCIAL LITERACY TRAINING for all students during induction period
- STUDENT HAIRDRESSERS/BARBERS on campus, with fixed student-friendly prices
- FIXED-RATE FLEXIBLE GYM MEMBERSHIPS ensuring that the current £20 per month mebership remains for the forseeable future

My main reasons for running for president of the Student Union are to help university life become a safer and more pleasant experience and to find solutions to the backlog of accessing key areas of support offered by student services.

I will first talk about my 2 main campaign promises:

Student Safety:

Student safety is always at the forefront of every single person associated with any university's mind.

Having spent 2 years in Leicester I have noticed a few things that can help to improve this. These things are:

- More lighting on university road, whether this is subtle lamps or speaking higher up in the
 university/local council, something needs to be done to ensure a safer and more visible route
 to and from the university when it is dark.
- Finding ways to ensure that more students can come forward when difficult times are happening, or a difficult event has occurred. Although the support teams are amazing, it can often be difficult to be able to locate and/or have the confidence to talk, my solution would be having more events tailored especially to fit these needs.
- Speaking to local emergency services to ensure that student's safety is carried forward to outside of campus. The University experience is not just limited to on campus, it extends into the main and wider community of Leicester, I would like to have a more "hands-on" approach to ensure that the Union is fully able to liaise and communicate with local authorities to ensure that every measure for student safety is being fully met, and that any services that can support students have been acknowledged by the university.
- Understanding and acknowledging the rise in crime that has been creeping up for the last decade. The Leicester Tab stated One in 25 students at Leicester University will be a victim of crime according to new statistics. Although this was in 2016, the same can be inferred to be a grave risk. I would propose to come up with a budding system held by volunteers for the university to ensure safety for people who go out in Leicester. This would work by volunteers offering to walk people home from o2 events or waiting for Ubers outside of the university. For events outside of the campus, each volunteer would have several people that they would have contact with and talk to if a serious incident occurs outside in the main city centre.

Finding solutions to the backlog of accessing key areas of support offered by student services.

- As of this moment, talking to students who are awaiting campus-based counselling services, the current estimated wait time is 6 WEEKS.
- I aim to be able to speak to advisors and higher-up officials overseeing these services and see
 why this is occurring and whether the Student Union can find either a way to find more
 student support officers or ask external organisations to come and offer support and sign-up
 days for their services.

Finding ways to help elevate the financial stress of university.


- During university, all of us are in the same or similar positions financially, the
 way that I would help to build a team, where the sole purpose is to compile
 lists of grants and bursaries available for students who are financially
 struggling and come for help.
- I would also liaise with local businesses and shops to see if there would be any chance of students receiving discounts and/or further promotions.
- I would also aim to run the University bus service to more affordable supermarkets for students on a semi-regular basis, examples of these being Asda, Aldi, Lidl, etc.

Improving general facilities all over campus and off-campus learning places.

- The facilities that the university offers are some of the best offered in the country but I believe that we can make these facilities even better.
- I would put more water fountains across campus, as someone who often uses refillable water bottles, I can often find it difficult to be able to refill these bottles and can find myself often spending money on single-use plastic bottles.
- Make sure that all the electrical outlets in buildings are working correctly, the worst part of any lecture is when your laptop loses charge and the fear of not being able to charge your laptop. Adding to this point, in lecture theatres that are lacking charger points I would aim to see if more could be added.



- Make sure pins are always stocked so no one has to use a pronoun badge that doesnt fit their identity


