





**'STICKY' CAMPUS  
SURVEY RESULTS  
2021/22**

Survey conducted during the 2021/22 Academic Year and yielded 17 responses.

### What is the main reason for leaving campus after lectures?



### What could you we do on campus to get you to stick around after lectures?



The two largest factors that are resulting in students choosing to leave campus after a lecture are the price of food items (29%) and wanting a space to rest following a lecture (24%).

These statements are echoed by the respondents stating that possible improvements that would encourage them to spend more time on campus include more affordable food options (30%), as well as a pub/bar area on campus (5%) and either a quiet space (5%) or a map that leads students to quiet rest areas (5%). This suggests that the best way to encourage students to spend more time on campus is to reduce the cost of food items and provide quiet areas in which students can relax and de-stress post lectures.

Another large factor that reduces the time spent on campus is the bus timetable. 12% of respondents referenced an infrequent bus timetable as a reason why they leave campus after lectures, and a further 15% cited more frequent buses as a factor that would encourage them to spend more time on campus. Therefore, introducing a more frequent bus service/shuttle bus between main campus, other university run sites and student accommodation, could be a way to encourage students to spend more time on campus.

There are also several suggestions made by the respondents that show that adjustments made to the library, such as a vending machine (5%), increased heating (5%) and areas designed for quiet relaxation (5%) would be beneficial for students. These adjustments would also encourage students to spend a longer period of time within the library, encouraging students to increase the amount of time that they spend on campus.
